

Student At-a-Glance

Summary: A quick reference sheet detailing student likes, dislikes, reinforcers, IEP goals, and more.

When to use:

- At-a-glance reminders of IEP goals, favorite reinforcers, or potential challenges
- Reference for staff less familiar with a student, such as an elective teacher, occupational therapist or substitute.

How to use:

1. The information for a student profile can come from a variety of sources. Family, teachers, paraeducators, specialists, health professional or the student may all provide helpful information when building a student profile.
2. Some categories you might include:
 - a. Age, grade, photo, and other identifying facts
 - b. Strengths and challenges
 - c. Likes and dislikes
 - d. IEP goals
 - e. BIP steps
 - f. Assistive technology/ accommodations
 - g. Modes of communication
 - h. Reinforcers
 - i. Medical issues or concerns
3. Keep your student reference sheets on hand, up to date, and organized in a folder or on a binder ring.

Tip: Keep an up to date duplicate copy with your substitute materials.
